TEN's volunteer center in Israel is situated within Kibbutz Harduf's peaceful forest in the lower Galilee community. The Kibbutz is renowned for its dedication to fostering social and educational community initiatives that promote Jewish-Arab collaboration, empower marginalized populations, and strive for equal opportunities.

In close partnership with local nonprofit organizations, our volunteering sites encompass a range of impactful endeavors. These include teaching English in Arab schools, contributing to Beit Elisha—a rehabilitative community for adults with special needs—participating in organic agricultural farming in the "Sha'ar La'Adam" forest, supporting at-risk youth at the Tuvia Boarding School, and more.





Our primary aim is to contribute to community development through our volunteering efforts, while also facilitating personal growth among our volunteers through additional after-hour lessons and activities.

Volunteers engage in various activities such as weekly Hebrew and Arabic lessons, coexistence classes, singing classes, theater workshops, and more. These opportunities foster cultural understanding, promote personal growth, and create a supportive environment for our volunteers.



Communal living is an important part of our program as we engage in group activities, share meals, and work together in shifts on tasks like cooking and cleaning.

In our group, participants from different backgrounds find a welcoming and supportive community. This includes Israelis volunteering before their army service, students studying and working in Harduf, and Diaspora Jews volunteering through MASA and PZC. Being part of this community encourages personal reflection and growth as individuals learn about themselves and others.
